Justice Randall T. Eng is Of Counsel to Meyer, Suozzi, English & Klein, P.C., and a member of the Litigation Department, including the Appellate practice. Justice Eng also serves as referee, receiver and arbitrator within the firm's Alternative Dispute Resolution practice.

Immediately prior to joining Meyer Suozzi, Justice Eng served as the Presiding Justice of the Appellate Division, Second Department - the busiest and largest Judicial Department in the State of New York, covering Queens, Brooklyn, Staten Island, the counties of Nassau, Suffolk, Dutchess, Orange, Putnam, Rockland and Westchester, handling over 9,000 appeals per year. The presiding justice is the highest-ranking judge in the appellate

division, in charge of all of its operations, as well as a sitting practicing judge on panels of appeal.

Born in Guangzhou, China, Justice Eng was raised in New York City. He earned his undergraduate degree from State University of New York at Buffalo and his juris doctor degree from St. John's University School of Law in 1972.

Following law school, Justice Eng began his esteemed legal career in public service as an assistant district attorney in Queens County. At the time, he became the first Asian American appointed as an assistant prosecutor in New York State history and served in this role from 1973-1980. He then served as the Deputy Inspector General of the New York City Correction Department from 1980 to 1981, and later became the Inspector General, a role in which he served from 1981 to 1983.

In 1983, Justice Eng became the first Asian American to become a judge in New York State, when he was appointed to the Criminal Court of the City of New York by Mayor Edward I. Koch. He sat in the Criminal Court until 1988 when he was designated an Acting Justice of the New York State Supreme Court. In 1990 and 2004, Justice Eng was elected and reelected to full 14-year terms on that bench.

Following these terms, he was appointed Administrative Judge of the Criminal Term of Queens County Supreme Court in 2007 and served in that role until 2008. In 2012, Governor Andrew Cuomo appointed Justice Eng to lead the Second Department, where he became the first Asian American to serve as Presiding Justice in New York State's history.

In addition to his prolific legal career, Justice Eng proudly served his country as a member of the New York Army National Guard from 1970 until 2004, when he retired as State Judge Advocate holding the rank of Colonel.

A trailblazer in the Asian American legal community, Hugh H. Mo has built a legacy spanning nearly five decades of excellence in law, public service, and community leadership.

Mr. Mo was the first Asian-American Assistant District Attorney in the Manhattan District Attorney's Office and later made history as the first Asian-American Deputy Commissioner in Charge of Trials for the New York City Police Department — at the time, the highest-ranking Asian-American official in New York City government.

After 12 years in public service, he led the China Practice Group at Whitman & Ransom and represented Chinese government entities, state-owned enterprises, and multinational corporations in cross-border banking, corporate, litigation, and real estate matters. For the past 30 years, he has served as Principal of The Law Firm of Hugh H. Mo, P.C., and as legal counsel to both U.S. and overseas corporate and government clients.

Mr. Mo's five decades of investigative and trial experience include supervising complex financial fraud and internal corruption investigations, trying over fifty jury cases to verdict in federal and state courts, and presiding over more than 300 administrative trials within the NYPD. For the last 15 years, he has served as a Referee for the New York State Commission on Judicial Conduct, presiding over hearings involving judicial misconduct.

A lifelong civic leader, Mr. Mo has held numerous leadership roles, including Board President of the Chinese-American Planning Council, Co-Founder and President Emeritus of the NYPD Asian American Police Executives Council (AAPEX), and Co-Founder of cornerstone organizations such as the Chinatown Health Clinic (now the Charles B. Wang Community Health Center) and the Asian American Bar Association of New York (AABANY).

He has also advised and served on transition committees for numerous elected officials — from Mayor David Dinkins to District Attorneys Cyrus Vance Jr. and Melinda Katz — and was tapped by the Obama White House as an “outside validator” during Justice Sonia Sotomayor's Supreme Court confirmation hearings.

Born in Shanghai and raised on the Lower East Side, Mr. Mo is a proud Stuyvesant alumnus who earned his B.A. from New York University and J.D. from Boston University School of Law. Fluent in Mandarin Chinese, he has been a bridge between communities and continents throughout his distinguished career.

Alice Wong served as a Special Agent for the IRS-Criminal Investigation Division (IRS-CI) from 2000 to 2024, dedicating over two decades of service to federal law enforcement. Throughout her career, Alice specialized in digital forensics, playing a pivotal role in investigating complex financial crimes, cybercrimes, and money laundering. From 2013 until her retirement in 2024, she worked as a Computer Investigative Specialist, using her expertise to uncover digital evidence in support of criminal investigations.

In addition to her technical skills, Alice was also a seasoned instructor in several areas critical to law enforcement. As a Firearms Instructor, Fitness Coordinator, and Defensive Tactics Instructor, she was passionate about equipping fellow agents with the skills needed to excel in the field and remain prepared for any situation. Her commitment to both professional development and physical fitness was a cornerstone of her career.

Alice's career extended beyond just the investigation room; after the tragic 9/11 attacks, she played a significant role in the investigative efforts, including conducting interviews, surveillance operations, and the challenging search of the Staten Island Landfill for evidence related to the attacks. Her contributions were vital to the mission and are a testament to her dedication to national security.

Alice was an active member of several law enforcement organizations throughout her career. Since 2000, she has been an engaged member of the Society of Asian Federal Officers (SOAFO), supporting and promoting diversity within federal law enforcement. Additionally, Alice participated in the Federal Criminal Investigators Association (FCIA) charity softball event since 2008, raising funds to support the families of fallen brothers and sisters in law enforcement. This event is just one example of Alice's ongoing commitment to her colleagues and the broader law enforcement community.

In her post-law enforcement life, Alice also ventured into the world of international entrepreneurship. She played a key role in the opening of a sandwich shop in Bangkok, combining her passion for travel with her entrepreneurial spirit and desire to help others. Her experience in international business and community development further reflects her diverse skill set and global perspective.

Beyond her professional endeavors, Alice has always valued personal growth and community involvement. She took part in a spiritual walk with a Monk, an experience that deepened her sense of mindfulness and reflection. In her personal time, she enjoys gardening and exploring the world, with a particular interest in immersing herself in different cultures and perspectives.

Alice's career and life have been driven by a deep sense of service, growth, and connection - values she carried with her through every investigation, every challenge, and every new experience

Patrick J. Campbell is a Trial Attorney with the U.S. Department of Justice, Fraud Section of the Criminal Division, assigned to the Northeast Health Care Fraud Strike Force in the United States Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of New York.

During his time with the Department, PJ has investigated and prosecuted a variety of cases involving healthcare and wire fraud, the unlawful distribution of opioids, tax offenses, and money laundering. His cases relate to schemes involving corporate wrongdoing, prescription drug diversion and fraud, social adult day care and home health care fraud, physical and occupational therapy fraud, and criminal violations of the Anti-Kickback Statute. PJ has tried seven criminal jury cases as a prosecutor and conducted numerous appeals. He currently serves as a Fraud Section hiring coordinator.

Prior to joining the Department, PJ was a litigation associate at two law firms in New York where he represented clients in a variety of complex civil and criminal investigations and litigations, including matters involving cross-border investigations concerning financial products, violations of the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act and False Claims Act, and advertising claims in the pharmaceutical and consumer products space. While in private practice, PJ maintained a robust pro bono practice representing military veterans and asylum seekers, and in 2019 he was awarded the New York City Bar, City Bar Justice Center's Jeremy G. Epstein Award for Outstanding Pro Bono Service. Between 2017 and 2018, PJ clerked for the Honorable Dora L. Irizarry in the Eastern District of New York. Prior to law school, PJ spent two years teaching eighth grade math with Teach for America in the Rio Grande Valley, Texas.

PJ is a cum laude graduate of St. Lawrence University and a cum laude graduate of St. John's University School of Law, where he was on the St. John's Law Review.

Paul served almost 30 years in federal service. He started with the IRS in the 1970s, doing stints with the Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF at the time), and finally retiring with the US Customs Service in 2005.

When Paul started his law enforcement career, he was one of the few Asians in the role, therefore, making him a pioneer in the field. Paul never shied away from the hardships of being a pioneer. In fact, Paul, along with a few of the other Asians he met in federal law enforcement, became the founding fathers of the Society of Asian Federal Officers (SOAFO) in 1990, and Paul served as its president from 2003-2004. Paul continued to advocate for Asians and SOAFO throughout his career and his life, even in retirement.

I remember as a new Postal Inspector, attending a SOAFO meeting hosted by Paul at the old How's Bayou restaurant/bar on Greenwich Street in TriBeCa. As a relatively new federal agent, it was fascinating to see how relaxed he was, but totally in charge, making sure he acknowledged all the attendees and making sure everyone was having fun at the meeting. – Yui Chow

Besides his passion for golf and cigar, Paul loved his wife and family, providing for them was always priority one.

Senior Special Agent Douglas Loo dedicated almost 30 years of service to our country in the U.S. Army, Internal Revenue Service, and with the U.S. Customs Service. In December of 2000, he retired from Customs after a distinguished career in federal law enforcement.

In 1990, Doug was one of the founding fathers of the Society of Asian Federal Officers (SOAFO). He was always supportive and an active member of the organization. Doug will always be remembered as a vibrant and dedicated man who put forth his personal time to promote the Society in the most positive light. Everyone admired Doug's energetic ability to attend the needs of both his family and the Society.

Doug is survived by his wife Ellen and three children Craig, Jeffrey, Danielle and five grandchildren.



Senior Special Agent Paul Chen served almost 30 years in federal service. Paul was a founding father of SOAFO in 1990, along with a few other visionary Asian federal agents, and served as its president from 2003-2004.

Paul was a mentor to many of the new Asian agents, always willing to "tell it like it is" and guided them through the landscape of federal service and as federal agents. He spent long hours promoting the Society and even after retiring, Paul remained an active member till his passing. Paul loved to golf and smoke cigars, but above all, he loved his family and provided for them with his dedicated long work hours in the field.

Paul is survived by his wife Annie, sons Christopher, Scott, Evan, daughter-in-laws Catherine, Patricia, Megan, and six grandchildren.

In honor of Doug and Paul's dedication and devotion to the Society, the SOAFO Foundation Scholarship program was renamed the Douglas Loo/Paul Chen Scholarship.

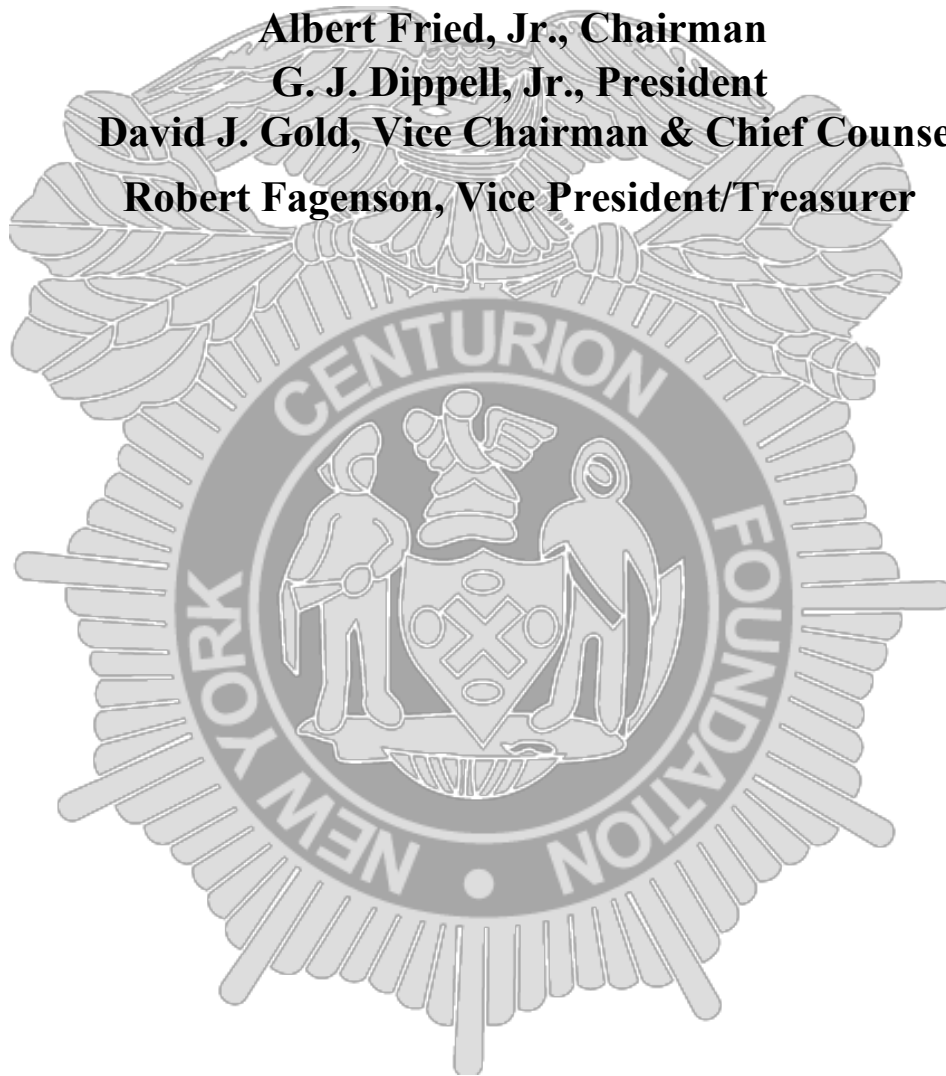

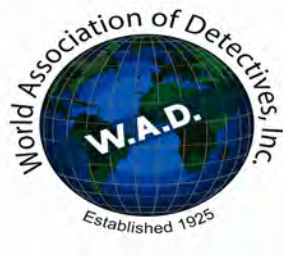
