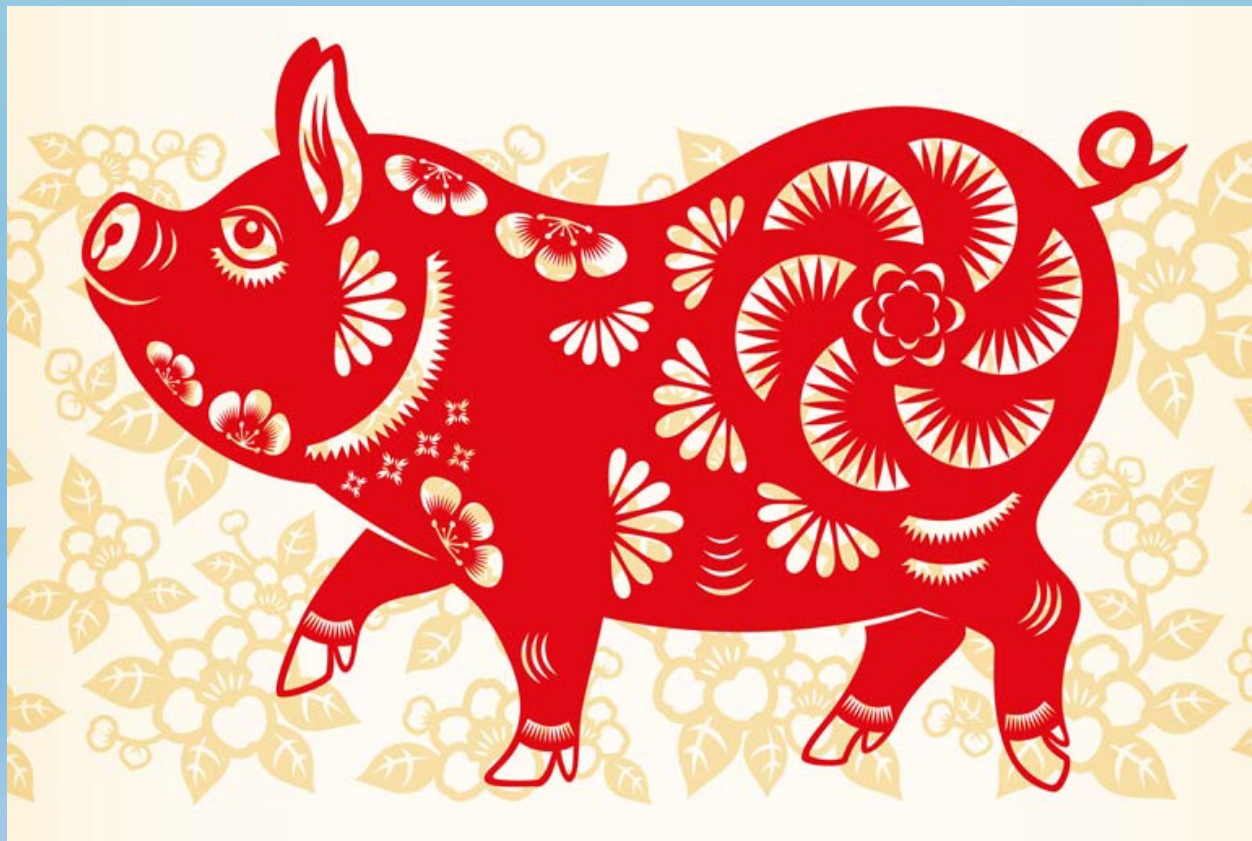

Person of the Year 2019
Lorna G. Schofield
U.S. District Judge, Southern District of New York



The Honorable Lorna G. Schofield was nominated by President Obama and confirmed by a unanimous U.S. Senate vote as a United States District Judge for the Southern District of New York on December 13, 2012. She is the first Filipino-American to serve as an Article III federal judge.

Previously, Judge Schofield was a litigation partner at the international law firm of Debevoise & Plimpton LLP from 1991 to 2011. Judge Schofield's practice focused on litigation in complex commercial matters, including the defense of companies and individuals in regulatory and white collar criminal investigations. She also conducted internal and independent investigations on behalf of companies, their Boards of Directors and Audit Committees. On the civil side, she represented clients in private disputes, including class actions, corporate bankruptcies, business fraud, professional liability and commercial disputes. Judge Schofield is an experienced trial attorney, building on the trial experience she gained as a federal prosecutor. Her trials include the successful defense of celebrity Rosie O'Donnell at trial in a \$100 million lawsuit brought by the former publishers of Rosie magazine and a class action jury trial for one of the Big Four accounting firms in which the jury returned a favorable verdict after only thirty minutes.

Judge Schofield was an associate at Cleary Gottlieb Steen & Hamilton LLP from 1981 to 1984. From 1984 to 1988, Judge Schofield served as an Assistant US Attorney in the Criminal Division of the US Attorney's Office for the Southern District of New York.

She is a former chair of the American Bar Association Section of Litigation, an organization in which she held many leadership positions over twenty years. Judge Schofield has written and spoken frequently about trial tactics and women in the legal profession, and has mentored many Asian American law students and attorneys since being appointed in 2012.

Judge Schofield received her B.A. magna cum laude from Indiana University and her J.D. from New York University, where she was an editor of the New York University Law Review.

Lifetime Achievement

Dr. Henry C. Lee

**Chair Professor & Founder of Forensic Research Training Center
University of New Haven**



Dr. Henry C. Lee is one of the world's foremost forensic scientists. Dr. Lee's work has made him a landmark in modern-day criminal investigations. He has been a prominent player in many of the most challenging cases of the last 50 years. Dr. Lee has worked with law enforcement agencies in helping to solve more than 8000 cases. In recent years, his travels have taken him to England, Bosnia, Canada, China, Brunei, Bermuda, Germany, Singapore, Thailand, Middle East, South America and other locations around the world.

Dr. Lee's testimony figured prominently in the O. J. Simpson, Jason Williams, Peterson, and Kennedy Smith Trials; and in convictions of the "Woodchipper" murderer as well as thousands of other murder cases. Dr. Lee has assisted local and state police in their investigations of other famous crimes, such as the murder of Jon Benet Ramsey in Boulder, Colorado, the 1993 suicide of White House Counsel Vincent Foster, the death of Chandra Levy, the kidnapping of Elizabeth Smart, and the reinvestigation of the Kennedy assassination. He was a consultant for more than 800 law enforcement agencies.

Dr. Lee is currently the director of Forensic Research and Training Center and Distinguished Professor in Forensic Science of the University of New Haven. He was the Chief Emeritus for the Connecticut State Police during 2000-2010 and was the Commissioner of Public Safety for the State of Connecticut during 1998 to 2000 and has served as the state's Chief Criminalist from 1978 to 2000. Dr. Lee was the driving force in establishing a modern state police communication system, Community based police services sex offender and DNA databank, major crime investigation concepts and advanced forensic science services in Connecticut.

In 1975, Dr. Lee joined the University of New Haven, where he created the school's Forensic Sciences program. He has also taught as a professor at more than a dozen universities, law schools, and medical schools. Though challenged with the demands on his time, Dr. Lee still

lectures throughout the country and world to police, Universities and civic organizations. Dr. Lee has authored hundreds of articles in professional journals and has co-authored more than 40 books, covering the areas, such as; DNA, Fingerprints, Trace Evidence, Crime Scene Investigation and Crime Scene Reconstruction. He is the author of some best sellers, such as *Famous Crimes Revisited*, *Cracking Cases: the science of solving crimes*, *Blood Evidence*, and *Cracking More Cases*. In addition, his textbooks such as *Forensic Science*, *Physical Evidence* and *Henry Lee's Crime Scene Handbook* have been widely adopted in medical legal and forensic professions. He has appeared in many TV shows and movies. His new television series, *Trace Evidence – Dr. Henry Lee File* has received high ratings and has been broadcasted around the world.

Dr. Lee has been the recipient of numerous medals and awards, including the 1996 Medal of Justice from the Justice Foundation, and the 1998 Lifetime Achievement Award from the Science and Engineer Association. He has also been the recipient of the Distinguished Criminalist Award from the American Academy of Forensic Sciences (AAFS); the J. Donero Award from the International Association of Identification and in 1992 was elected a distinguished Fellow of the AAFS. He has also received the Lifetime Achievement Award from the American College of Forensic Examiners (ACFE) in 2000, Medal of Honor by the Ellis Island Foundation in 2004, Congressional Recognition for Outstanding services by the US Congress in 2004, Presidential Medal of Honor by the President of Croatia in 2005, Medal of Service from the Ministry of Interior, Taiwan, ROC in 2006, and Gusi Peace Award from the Philippines in 2008.

Dr. Lee was born in China in 1938 and raised up in Taiwan. Dr. Lee first worked for the Taipei Police Department, attaining the rank of Captain. Dr. Lee came to the United States in 1965, and he earned his B.S. in Forensic Science from John Jay College in 1972. Dr. Lee continued his studies in biochemistry at NYU where he earned his Master's Degree in 1974 and his Ph.D. in 1975. He has also received special training from the FBI Academy, ATF, RCMP, and other organizations. He is a recipient of 20 Honorary degrees: Doctorate Degrees of Science from the University of New Haven, University of Connecticut, Honorary Doctorate of Law from Roger Williams Law School, Mitchell College, American International University and Taiwan Scientific Technology University, Honorary Doctorate Degree in Humane Letters from the University of Bridgeport, St. Joseph College, Armstrong University, in recognition of his contributions to Law and Science.

Prosecutor of the Year
Diane Gujarati
Deputy Chief Criminal Division



Diane Gujarati is an Assistant United States Attorney at the United States Attorney's Office for the Southern District of New York, where she has worked since 1999 and where she has served since 2012 as a Deputy Chief of the Criminal Division. Prior to her tenure as Deputy Chief of the Criminal Division, Ms. Gujarati served as Deputy Chief and then Chief of the White Plains Division, as a Deputy Chief of the Appeals Unit in the Criminal Division, and as a line prosecutor in various units within the Criminal Division, including the Securities and Commodities Fraud, Organized Crime & Terrorism, and Narcotics units. Ms. Gujarati has extensive federal investigative, trial, and appellate experience and has handled cases involving a wide variety of criminal offenses. She also has significant experience in the area of government ethics. In addition, Ms. Gujarati serves as the Elder Justice Coordinator for the United States Attorney's Office.

Prior to joining the United States Attorney's Office, Ms. Gujarati was a law clerk to the Honorable John M. Walker, Jr. of the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit and a litigator at Davis, Polk & Wardwell. Ms. Gujarati graduated *summa cum laude* from Barnard College of Columbia University with a B.A. in Economics and received her J.D. from Yale Law School, where she served as an editor of the *Yale Law Journal*. Prior to law school, Ms. Gujarati worked as an analyst in the Banking and Corporate Finance Group at Chemical Bank.

In addition to her work as a federal prosecutor, Ms. Gujarati served for four years on the Board of the Asian American Bar Association of New York (2015-2019) and currently serves on the Professional Ethics Committee of the Association of the Bar of the City of New York and on the Advisory Board of the Program on Corporate Compliance and Enforcement at New York University School of Law. Ms. Gujarati has also served as an Adjunct Professor of Clinical Law at New York University School of Law.

Member of the Year

Gok H. Mark

U.S. Postal Inspector & OIG Special Agent

U.S. Postal Service, New York Office



Special Agent (Ret.) Gok Mark was one of eight children of the Mark Family. Due to the generosity of his Uncle Jerry and Aunt Virginia, he immigrated to America in 1966 at the age of ten. Assimilation to a new culture was difficult but Gok had the support of his grandfather and family. Gok had a strong drive to be a successful and a productive member of society and joined the United States Postal Service in 1979, while attending college.

Gok began his thirty-four year career in government service as a Postal Service temporary worker but his dedication and drive were recognized by his superiors and he worked his way up the ranks from mail carrier, general supervisor, carrier superintendent, mail processor foreman and Officer in Charge of the Monsey Post Office to the position of Postmaster, for Suffern New York.

Then, in June of 1993, Gok was accepted to United States Postal Inspection Service and began his federal law enforcement career. At the Inspection Service he served on many teams in the New York Division including External Crimes, Narcotics, Prohibited Mail, Mail Bombs and Worker Compensation Fraud. In 2003, he accepted the assignment to go to the United States Postal Service, Office of Inspector General as a Special Agent. As a Subject Matter Expert in worker's compensation fraud in the USPS, he helped develop the OIG's worker compensation fraud program. Gok received numerous recognition awards during both his Postal Service and law enforcement career, but feels his greatest reward is his thirty-three years of marriage to wife, Janice as they enjoy their three children's many successes. Special Agent (Ret.) Gok Mark still resides in Westchester with his wife.
